and continue touring the other ships until regular closing time (5pm in spring and summer, 4:30pm in fall and

DIRECTIONS TO BATTLESHIP COVE

GPS: Battleship Cove, 5 Water St., Fall River, MA 02721

Please be aware that there is a major construction project now underway in our immediate vicinity. The Route 79/Braga Bridge Improvements Project has set up a website to keep area motorists up to date with changes in traffic patterns. FROM BOSTON AND POINTS NORTH

Take Interstate 93 South (Southeastern Expressway) to 128 South; take Route 24 South to Fall River, Massachusetts; take Exit 7 (State Route 79); Follow Rt. 79 Southbound and exit onto Davol Street. Move to right traffic lane and continue to follow Davol Street southbound to traffic light. Take right on Central Street and follow down the hill into Battleship Cove. Watch for the parking signs/lot attendant for parking instructions.

FROM NEW YORK STATE & POINTS NORTHWEST

Take Massachusetts Turnpike to Route 495 South; take Route 24 South to Fall River and take Exit 7 (State Route 79); take Davol Street Exit (2nd Exit) and follow the signs (Waterfront, Heritage State Park, or Battleship Cove) along the waterfront to Battleship Cove. Or

Take Mass. Turnpike to 146 South to 95 South; From 95 South take 195 East to Mass.; take Exit 5 from the Braga Bridge in Fall River. Once on the exit ramp, bear left, and then bear left again once you reach the road (Milliken Blvd. - Dunkin Donuts is in front of you). Take a left on Milliken Blvd. and follow road over the highway to the traffic light. Take the left onto Central St. and proceed down the hill, straight through the traffic light and into the parking lot. Watch for the parking signs/lot attendant for parking instructions.

FROM PROVIDENCE, RI & POINTS SOUTH & WEST

Take Interstate 95N to 195 East; follow 195 East for approximately 14 miles, (do not take exit 5 in Rhode Island-proceed into Mass); take Exit 5 from the Braga Bridge in Fall River, MA. Once on the exit ramp, bear left, then left again once you reach the road (Milliken Blvd.- Dunkin Donuts is in front of you). Take a left on Milliken Blvd. and follow road over the highway to the traffic light. Take the left onto Central St. and proceed down the hill, straight through the traffic light and into the parking lot. Watch for the parking signs/lot attendant for parking instructions.

FROM CAPE COD AND POINTS EAST

Take Interstate 195 West to Fall River, MA; take Exit 5 (before the Braga Bridge); stay in the left lane as you exit onto Central Street. Go straight through the traffic light, down the hill into Battleship Cove. Watch for the parking signs/lot attendant for parking instructions.

FROM THE NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND AREA

Take State Route 114 North or 138 North to Route 24 North. Take Interstate 195 West to Fall River, MA. Take Exit 5 (before the Braga Bridge); stay in the left lane as you exit onto Central Street. Go straight through the traffic light, down the hill into Battleship Cove. Watch for the parking signs/lot attendant for parking instructions.

SAFETY RULES & MUSEUM MANNERS

Please brief your group on the following rules and regulations before they begin touring the ships. Our wish is to provide a safe and enjoyable experience for all involved.

Group leaders, parents and chaperones are responsible for monitoring their group's behavior at ALL times throughout their visit at Battleship Cove.

FIRE DRILL- A fire drill will be held at the end of check-in time. Please listen for the announcements. You will exit your berthing areas by following yellow fire escape lines on the deck and assemble on the fantail for roll call. Please keep away from the gangway, since this is where firefighters will board the ship in the event of a fire.

- I. **NO RUNNING.** Running is not permitted aboard any of the ships. If you trip and fall, it's going to hurt; remember steel is harder than concrete! **BE CAREFUL AND ALWAYS WALK!**
- 2. **WEAR PROPER FOOTWEAR.** Shoes that are secure on the feet should be worn. Flip-flops, slides, and shoes or sandals that slip off the foot easy pose a slip and fall hazard and should not be worn.
- 3. **NO CLIMBING.** For your safety, restricted areas are clearly marked. Climbing on the gun barrels or into restricted areas on the superstructure may result in injury. No one should climb into or onto exhibits that are closed off by plexiglass, chains, doors or areas marked as such. Remember ladders must be used when traveling from one level to another.
- 4. **BE CAUTIOUS WHEN TOURING THE SHIPS**. Be aware of low ceilings and overhead obstructions. Be extremely careful when traveling up and down ladders aboard the ships; move in single file, grip handrails firmly, go slowly, and be alert. Note: Ship ladders are steeper than conventional stairways.
- 5. NO ONE IS ALLOWED ON THE UPPER LEVELS AFTER DARK. In addition, the outdoor main deck is off limits after dark to campers unless they are accompanied by an adult.
- 6. NO LEANING OVER THE SIDES OF THE SHIPS OR THROUGH THE LIFELINES.
- 7. **NO SMOKING.** The ships and buildings at Battleship Cove are designated as non-smoking areas.
- 8. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE ALLOWED.
- 9. **VANDALISM WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.** Many artifacts at Battleship Cove are irreplaceable. Do not remove, deface or break any of the equipment/artifacts at Battleship Cove. Our goal is the preservation of these great ships for future generations. Vandalism will result in the removal of guilty parties from the Cove and possible prosecution. Please help us by reporting any suspicious activity during your visit.
- 10. NO EATING OR DRINKING IN UNDESIGNATED AREAS ABOARD THE SHIPS. Any food purchased or brought on board must be consumed in the Wardroom/Cafeteria or in the Student Orientation Center or Wardroom Annex during movie time. Please do not eat/store food in the bunking areas where there is a risk of stains on the canvas bunks and spills on the deck where someone could slip and fall.
- 11. **LEADERS AND CHAPERONES MUST REMAIN WITH THEIR GROUPS DURING THEIR STAY.**Children should be accompanied and directly supervised <u>at ALL times</u> during your visit. Please do not leave the Battleship Cove complex unless there is an emergency, in which case we ask that you contact a staff member.

FIRST AID

First Aid is available to injured campers. Please contact an Overnight Staff member for assistance. For injuries more serious than minor cuts and scrapes, we send the camper to a local hospital for treatment. If you are unable to locate an Overnight Staff member, please ask someone at the snack bar in the Wardroom/cafeteria to page the staff for you. Access to the public address system is available through the Overnight Staff. Instruct your group to listen to all announcements; they will inform you of upcoming events and provide you with important instructions.
