## **2021 Narragansett Council Family Camp Guidelines**

- Family Camp programs take place predominantly outdoors.
- Eligible parents, youth and Family Camp staff are strongly encouraged to receive the vaccine prior to
- Unvaccinated campers and staff should be tested prior to their initial arrival using either a PCR or BinaxNow test.
- Unvaccinated campers and staff should obtain a negative PCR test within 72 hours of coming to camp.
- Non-vaccinated campers and staff are required to wear masks when three feet of social distancing cannot be maintained outdoors (except during aquatics activities).
- Non-vaccinated campers and staff are required to wear masks and maintain 6-feet social distancing indoors (including bathrooms, trading post, dining hall, and changing rooms).
- Fully vaccinated: Staff and campers need to wear masks indoors, they do not need to wear masks outdoors.
- An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their final dose.
- Vaccination records must be included with medical forms.
- Following BSA youth protection guidelines, campers may only share tents or teepees with members of their household.
- Increased daily sanitization of shared equipment and spaces including restrooms and changing facilities.
- Additional sanitization and handwashing stations will be provided throughout camp.
- <u>Using the COVID-19 Screening Tool</u>, families and caregivers should check campers for symptoms prior to arrival and throughout their stay and will serve as the primary screening mechanism for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Campers and staff with symptoms are required to stay home.
- If a symptomatic individual tests negative, they may return to activities after their symptoms have improved and have been without fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.
- Additional staff will be on hand to help monitor camper safety and camp sanitization.
- All staff are trained to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Campers and staff displaying symptoms of COVID-19 will be required to go home.
- Campers will receive orientation at start of camp with updated rules and procedures.
- Families will receive an orientation email with updated rules and guidelines the week prior to their arrival at Family Camp.
- Non-essential visitors will not be allowed in camp.
- All campers and participants must pre-register.
- In the event of inclement weather or emergencies, campers will congregate indoors while following indoor COVID-19 procedures.
- Campers are not allowed to share food or water bottles.
- Campers must remain on site during the duration of the Family Camp program
- Unvaccinated campers and staff should be tested prior to their initial arrival using either a PCR or BinaxNow test.
- Additional outdoor dining areas will be provided.
- Guidelines subject to change based on updated state, CDC and BSA guidance.
