This year, we are proud to celebrate 5.4% growth in new youth joining Scouting, a powerful sign that families are seeking the values, adventure, and leadership development Scouting offers.

Our Units Are Leading the Charge

Exceptional leadership and vibrant programming are fueling this momentum. Some standout packs lit up the year with impressive recruitment success:

- Pack 5 North Kingstown welcomed an incredible 39 new Scouts, setting the pace for growth
- Pack 49 Taunton led its district with 29 new Scouts, showcasing outstanding community engagement
- Pack 74 Dartmouth and Pack 7 Somerset each grew by 23 new Scouts, strengthening Scouting's impact in their communities

291,038 Pounds of Food Collected

This year's Scouting for Food drive collected an incredible 291,038 pounds of food and pushed the lifetime impact past 10 million pounds. Thousands of Scouts across Rhode Island, southeastern Massachusetts, and southeastern Connecticut answered the call during a time of heightened need.

Donations were delivered to the Rhode Island Community Food Bank and more than 50 local pantries, showcasing Scouting's commitment to doing a Good Turn daily and supporting families across Southeastern New England.

Exploring is our coed, career-focused program for teens—continued its strong momentum in 2025 with another year of membership growth.

- More than 50 Explorers from 7 Police Posts participated
- Highlights included the Top Shot tournament, vehicle investigations, and crime scene processing

Law Enforcement Exploring Academy

- Partnered with the National Guard to host training at Camp Varnum
- 30 Explorers worked alongside active law enforcement
- Developed practical skills arrest procedures, building clearing, crash investigation, and public speaking
- New this year, Explorers spent a day at Camp Yawgoog, where they participated in range and target activities, flew drones, and tackled the Challenge Course

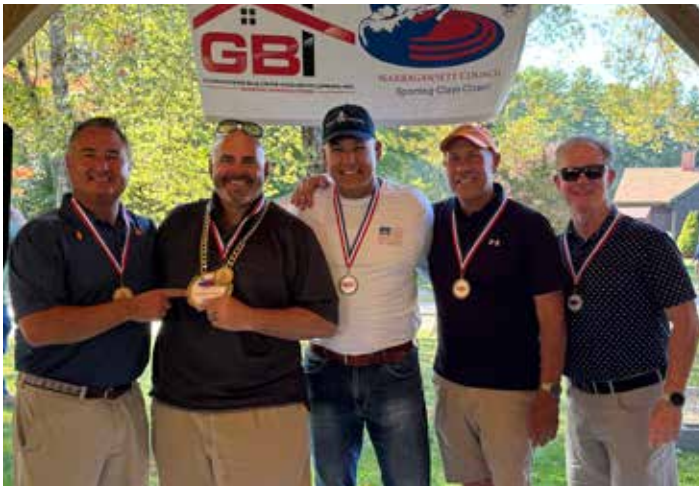

In 2025 alone, the event generated \$71,531 a remarkable achievement that reflects the strength of our community.

To recognize their efforts, our highest-selling Scouts were celebrated and enjoyed an evening game with their families at the P-Bruins (Providence Bruins) on January 9, 2026. Once again, Pack 12 of North Attleboro led all units by selling an impressive \$33,287 in popcorn—funding their entire Scouting year.
